Tax Installment Payment Plan - TIPP

The Tax Installment Payment Plan (TIPP) allows residents to sign up for a monthly, direct withdrawal of their property tax payments from their bank accounts.

This plan provides taxpayers the opportunity to pay their property taxes in monthly installments rather than the one large single payment that comes due once per year. The plan runs from January 1-December 31, yearly. For the 2021 taxation year, your application must be received no later than February 15, 2022, provided that a pro-rated portion of your taxes are paid in advance.

Utility Increase

Dear Resident, we wish to advise you that there will be an increase of \$14 bi-monthly on utility services. To be put into effect on January 1, 2022. You will see the increase on your March invoice. This increase is due to needed upgrades on aging infrastructure and reductions in provincial grants. The town of Lamont is committed to offering you the quality you expect and deserve.

Water System Upgrades

The Town of Lamont would like to thank residents for their patience as water system upgrades were completed along 50th Avenue on December 2-4, 2021. These upgrades will help secure and protect our water distribution system. The residents cooperation through the water service disruption and road closure was appreciated.

Snow Angels Program

FCSS Lamont County Region is looking for volunteers who are willing to help people within the community who are unable to get outside and clear their own sidewalks and driveways of snow. Volunteers can be adults and school age children or it can even be a family. The volunteer is committed to the same resident throughout the Winter season but may assist more than one person, if desired. All residents on the program will fill out an application form and all volunteers must complete an application form and a criminal record check with the local RCMP detachment prior to being put on the list. This service is free and offered in all communities across the County provided we have volunteers.

Dog Licenses

Dog licenses are due on January 31st of each year. There is a yearly \$15 fee for spayed or neutered (unable to reproduce) and \$25 for animals that are unaltered or a lifetime fee of \$120.00 for spayed or neutered and \$200 for unaltered.

Black Knot

Black Knot is recognized by clumpy, tar-like, black masses of abnormal growths on the branches of trees. Infection spreads rapidly, and ultimately leads to the eventual death of the plant. You are required to remove any black knot branches from trees on your property.

Remove infected branches to at least 6-8 inches below the knot. Cutting blades should be cleaned and disinfected after each cut. For knots on scaffold branches or trunks that can't be removed, cut away diseased tissue down to good wood and at least one centimeter beyond the edge of the knot. Diseased wood must be destroyed immediately (burned, buried or removed from site and disposed of at the landfill).
